



The purpose of officially recognized supporter groups is to create a safe, distinctive, exciting, and memorable atmosphere for fans and players alike, here at Lexington Sporting Club matches.

Throughout the United Soccer League 1, officially recognized supporter groups retain access to certain privileges and benefits that are approved by the Club. These privileges include, but are not limited to, the use of banners, flags, tifos, drums and other instruments, and controlled smoke devices to assist in building the Lexington Sporting Club experience, creating match day traditions, and heightening home match atmosphere. Officially recognized supporter groups are also privileged to inside access, exclusive events, etc.

The purpose of this document is to provide quick, easy, and comprehensible access to the various policies, procedures, and information set forth by the United Soccer League 1 and Lexington Sporting Club into one all-encompassing document. These policies are in place to set precedent in providing the safest environment and best possible experience for you, the fans, the supporter groups, league officials, and the players and staff of Lexington Sporting Club.

On behalf of the players, the technical staff, the front office staff, and all of us here at Lexington Sporting Club, we thank you for your support. We can't wait to kick off our inaugural season.

VISITING SUPPORTER GROUP GUIDELINES

Lexington Sporting Club would like to welcome all visitors to our stadium, even those of our competitors within the league. We encourage visiting supporter groups to attend matches here in Lexington, to continue to heighten the match day experience and push our athletes to thrive within healthy competition.

Lexington Sporting Club encourages a lively, loud, and energetic matchday atmosphere, while also maintaining a respectful, fair, kind, and mindful approach to the different values and cultures of our fans and those in attendance. On match day, and at all Lexington Sporting Club events, the safety and welfare of others is and will remain the number one priority.

For these reasons, we ask all fans and supporter groups to abide by the following key tenets and policies of our code of conduct to guarantee the safety of our players, referees, club personnel, support staff, and fans, especially those present to support the visiting team. We also ask that each visiting supporter group reviews the List of Prohibited Items to ensure the safety of themselves and others.

Failure to comply with the rules and regulations set by the United Soccer League and Lexington Sporting Club will result in disciplinary action and/or sanctions, including the possibility of immediate dismissal and removal or suspension of any and all supporter group operations and/or privileges.

We thank you in advance for your cooperation and assistance in maintaining a safe and enjoyable environment.

TOYOTA STADIUM: PROHIBITED ITEMS

Certain exceptions to the list of prohibited items will be made for those fans attending Lexington Sporting Club matches as a member of an officially recognized visiting supporters' group, and for items pre-approved by Lexington Sporting Club, the United Soccer League, Georgetown College, and Toyota Stadium.

There are no provisions to check items at the gates upon entry or once inside the playing facility. Supporter group members, along with all and any who enter the playing facility, will be asked to either take prohibited items back to their car if they have not yet entered the venue or to dispose of prohibited items at the entrance of the facility.

Lexington Sporting Club, event staff, and security personnel reserve the right to inspect any item, at any time, and prohibit any item deemed distracting to players and match day officials, inappropriate for crowd safety, or detrimental to others enjoying the event.

If members of officially recognized supporter groups are found in possession of any prohibited items, this will result in disciplinary action and/or sanctions, including the possibility of immediate dismissal and removal or suspension of any and all supporter group operations and/or privileges.

For all patrons, including those who are members of officially recognized supporter groups of Lexington Sporting Club or the visiting club, possession of prohibited items is grounds for immediate dismissal and/or ejection from the playing facility, and may also include revocation of future ticket privileges. Match day tickets will be forfeited without refund.

TOYOTA STADIUM: PROHIBITED ITEMS

PROHIBITED ITEMS CAN BE FOUND BELOW:

- Weapons of any kind including, but not limited to, knives, pepper spray, stun guns, concealed weapons and firearms.
- Fireworks of any kind including, but not limited to, flares, smoke bombs, incendiary devices and pyrotechnics, other than those consistent with the Lexington Sporting Club Smoke Policy.
- Illegal drugs or harmful chemicals.
- Any missile or projectile like object.
- Aerosol cans or pressurized containers.
- Professional camera equipment; tripods, battery packs, large commercial video cameras, cameras with detachable lenses and/or lenses 6 in. or longer.
- Laser pointers or flashlights.
- Remote controlled aircraft or unmanned aircraft systems (drones).
- Animals (except assistive animals).
- Signs and/or banners larger than 2 ft. x 2 ft. (or any other item that could obstruct other patron's views) that are found outside the designated supporter group areas.
- Umbrellas (Fans should bring raincoats/ponchos for inclement weather).
- Outside food & beverage of any kind.
- Metal or glass containers of any kind.
- All bags over 13.5" x 10" x7".
- Non-clear bags over 4.5" x 6.5".
- Noisemakers that are found outside the designated supporter group areas
- Bikes, inline skates, skateboards, scooters, shoes with wheels.
- Frisbees or inflated balls of any kind.
- Un-approved pamphlets, handouts, advertisements, etc.
- Strollers or baby seats may not be taken into the stands or left in section entrances.
- Selfie sticks and/or monopods.
- Any other items deemed to be inappropriate and/or dangerous to the welfare of others and stadium safety.

TOYOTA STADIUM: STADIUM POLICY

Toyota Stadium, the home of Georgetown College athletics and Lexington Sporting Club, has been revamped in all aspects. Stadium policies have been updated and issued to accommodate all events and match days in correspondence with Lexington Sporting Club and USL League 1.

Failure to comply will result in disciplinary action and/or sanctions, including the possibility of immediate dismissal and removal or suspension of any and all supporter group operations and/or privileges surrounding the event, match, and/or venue. This may also include revocation of future ticket privileges. Match day tickets will be forfeited without refund.

TOYOTA STADIUM: STADIUM POLICY

STADIUM POLICY: FAN CODE OF CONDUCT

The following codes of conduct have been set in place by the United Soccer League to ensure a safe and welcoming environment at all league matches. In correspondence, Lexington Sporting Club will maintain, enforce, and uphold these policies.

Failure to comply will result in disciplinary action and/or sanctions, including the possibility of immediate dismissal and removal or suspension of any and all supporter group operations and/or privileges.

The United Soccer League and its member clubs, including Lexington Sporting Club, make providing a positive and memorable experience for their fans a priority.

TOYOTA STADIUM: STADIUM POLICY

"In an effort to foster a safe and comfortable atmosphere, the following fan guidelines are instituted at all USL matches:

- Fans will be respectful towards the players, staff, officials, and fellow fans.
- Fans will refrain from displaying signs, symbols, images, using language, or any other actions that are threatening, abusive, or discriminatory, including, but not limited to, on the basis of race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, gender, gender identity, ability, and/or sexual orientation.
- Fans will abide by both the venue and the USL Smoke Device Policy. Adherence to this policy includes only the use of approved devices, timing of use, locations, safety precautions, and users with signed waivers on file.
- Fans will follow directions from venue staff regarding compliance with the Fan Code of Conduct, stadium policies, and emergency procedures.
- Fans that consume alcohol will be of legal age and do so in a responsible fashion.
- Fans will not behave in ways that are unruly, disruptive, inappropriate, or illegal in nature.
- Fans will not fight or incite violence.
- Fans will not damage property either inside or outside the venue.
- Fans will not interfere with the progress of the match including entering the playing field or the surrounding area, throwing objects, including throwing objects on or towards the field or declining to promptly return a ball that has gone out of play.
- Violation of the Fan Code of Conduct will result in sanctions as deemed applicable by the United Soccer League office and Member Club including but not limited to warnings, ejections, venue bans, removal of supporter privileges, or arrest."

TOYOTA STADIUM: STADIUM POLICY

STADIUM POLICY: MATCH DAY GUIDELINES – GENERAL

At Lexington Sporting Club, we implement a zero-tolerance policy related to any form of harassment or discrimination on or off the field. The club has absolute authority and retains the right to institute punitive measures for any language, actions, or demonstrations deemed to be in violation of this policy. This policy includes, but is not limited to language, actions, or demonstrations based on an individual or group's race, religion, sexual orientation and/or sexual identity, national origin and/or ethnicity, gender, political views, age, disability.

- Language, actions, and demonstrations include, but are not limited to chants, cheers, songs, signs, banners, flags, disorderly conduct, abusive gestures, fighting, threatening, bullying, etc.
- Smoke devices, including flares, sparklers, and fireworks of any kind, will not be allowed in the Visiting Supporter Section. Any devices found will be confiscated immediately and will result in disciplinary action and/or sanctions, including the possibility of immediate dismissal and removal or suspension from the match and/or venue.
- Compliance with requests from Lexington Sporting Club and stadium and/or event staff regarding stadium and/or club policies and emergency response procedures.
- Neither the United Soccer League, nor Lexington Sporting Club, nor the facilities hosting Lexington Sporting Club matches and/or events are responsible for items that are left behind, lost, stolen, damaged or destroyed.

TOYOTA STADIUM: STADIUM POLICY

STADIUM POLICY: MATCH DAY GUIDELINES – FLAGS, BANNERS, ~~AND~~ TIFOS

- I. Flags, banners, tifos, and any other coordinated fan displays are privileges granted to the officially recognized supporter groups of throughout the United Soccer League. These items and displays are not permitted for use by general and/or ordinary fans. Members of officially recognized supporter groups are the only fans who are approved to actively participate in displays of this kind.
- II. All fan displays, including those of the visiting club's official supporter groups, in the form of flags, banners, and tifos must have their designs preapproved by the Lexington Sporting Club appointed supporter liaison and/or the match day operations team. The design and messaging of all tifo, banners, flags and signage must be approved at least 48 hours prior to the game and inspected upon entry to ensure compliance.

TOYOTA STADIUM: STADIUM POLICY

STADIUM POLICY: MATCH DAY GUIDELINES – FLAGS, BANNERS, ~~AND~~ TIFOS CONTINUED

- For general's sake, all displays must:
 - I. Support the club, the match, a player and/or players, the team, or an accomplishment.
 - II. Remain positive and be designed to add to the match day atmosphere, not detract from it.
 - III. Be the appropriate size set forth by Lexington Sporting Club
- For general's sake, all displays must NOT:
 - I. Unreasonably obstruct the view of the spectators outside of the designated supporters' sections, cover existing stadium signage, or present a public hazard by blocking aisles, walkways, or stairs.
 - II. Be taped, glued, or secured to the facility using adhesive of any kind.
 - III. In any way damage the facility walls, paint, railings, glass, or other facility property.
 - IV. Be constructed of wood, metal, or other materials that may cause harm to others as determined by Lexington Sporting Club or the facility management.
- Lexington Sporting Club all event staff and facility management staff reserve the right to deny entry of any flags, banners, tifos, and any other coordinated fan displays at any time. In addition, Lexington Sporting Club also reserves the right to suspend any and all flag, banner, or tifo activation without prior notice or explanation.
- Failure to comply with the rules and regulations set by Lexington Sporting Club will result in disciplinary action and/or sanctions, including the possibility of immediate dismissal and removal or suspension from the event, match, and/or venue.

TOYOTA STADIUM: STADIUM POLICY

STADIUM POLICY: MATCH DAY GUIDELINES – NOISEMAKERS, DRUMS, AND OTHER INSTRUMENTS

- I. The use of drums, other instruments, bullhorns, and noisemakers (excluding whistles) should be considered permitted for officially recognized supporter groups.
- II. Each visiting group must be with good standing of the United Soccer League and receive approval from Lexington Sporting Club at least 48 hours prior to the game and inspected upon entry to ensure compliance.
- III. Behavior of the visiting group, at all times, must conform to venue regulations and the Fan Code of Conduct. Lexington Sporting Club reserves the right to limit the number and/or type of drums, other instruments, bullhorns, noisemakers, etc. used on match days in the visiting supporter section.

TOYOTA STADIUM: STADIUM POLICY

STADIUM POLICY: MATCH DAY GUIDELINES – CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOL

- I. Alcoholic beverages must be consumed responsibly and only by those of legal age. Kentucky State Law forbids possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages by those under 21 years of age, as well as unauthorized distribution of alcohol on any licensed premises, and public intoxication.
- II. Kentucky State Law KRS 222.202 states that a person is guilty of public intoxication when he/she appears to be in a public space manifestly under the influence of alcohol to the degree that he/she may endanger himself/herself or other persons or property within his/her vicinity.
- III. Lexington Sporting Club and all event staff and facility management staff reserve the right to deny entry to any guests or supporter group members that appear to be intoxicated upon entry.
- IV. Those who fall subject to public intoxication by Kentucky state law, and any intoxicated guests causing a disturbance during a Lexington Sporting match day and/or event may result in ejection from the facility and/or arrest. Management also reserves the right to refuse service to anyone at any time.

TOYOTA STADIUM: STADIUM POLICY

STADIUM POLICY: MATCH DAY GUIDELINES – TAILGATING

- I. Tailgating will only be allowed in the designated tailgating areas set up by Lexington Sporting Club. Failure to comply may result in the loss of tailgating privileges, along with disciplinary action and/or sanctions, including the possibility of immediate dismissal and removal or suspension of any and all supporter group operations and/or privileges.
- II. All drinks should be placed in plastic/disposable cups and consumed at the tailgating location.
- III. No kegs, party balls, grills, propane tanks, or open fire pit devices are permitted in tailgating areas.
- IV. Amplified sound systems and/or the use of radio/audio devices at unreasonably loud levels is at the discretion of Lexington Sporting Club and facility management staff.
- V. Failure to clean up and dispose of trash appropriately will result in immediate loss of tailgating privileges.
- VI. Tailgating should not interfere with the normal flow of traffic or the activity of other fans.
- VII. Lexington Sporting Club is not responsible and cannot be held liable for accidents, damage, common loss, or theft of materials/items/personal property.
- VIII. Individuals who wish to partake in tailgating activities and privileges are responsible for compliance with all local and state laws governing alcohol consumption within the tailgating areas.

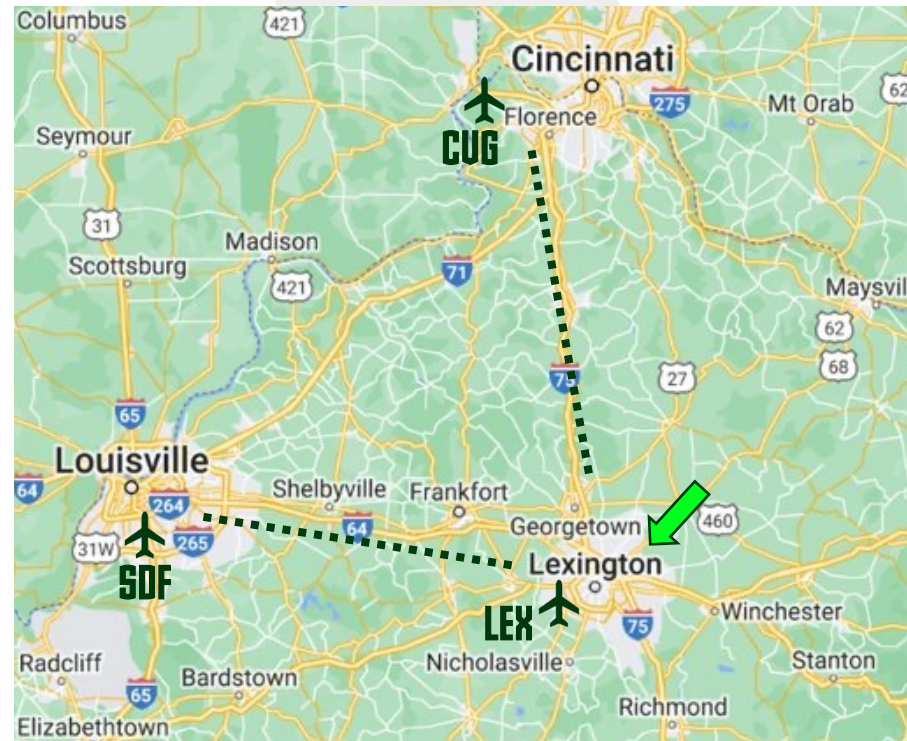

Main roadway that takes you from the southwest side of town (Blue Grass Airport) out to the east side (Hamburg Area).



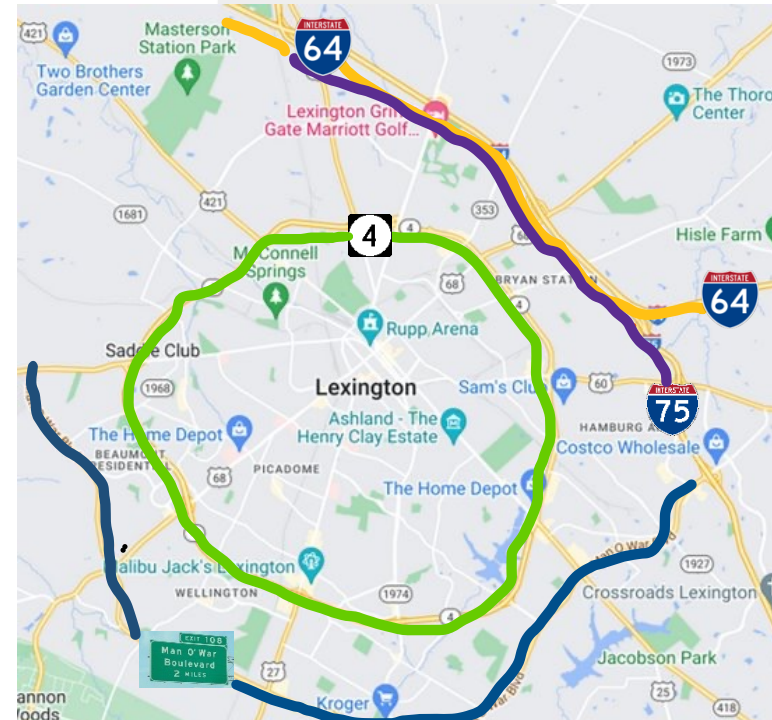

There are several options for ground transportation in and around both Lexington and Georgetown. If your trip requires a flight and it is more convenient to fly into a neighboring city, we recommend looking into a car rental company of your choosing in that specific area.

I. DIRECTIONS FROM THE SOUTH:

- I. I-75 North to Exit 125 (Georgetown); turn left off the ramp onto U.S. 460.
- II. Take a left at the first traffic light onto U.S. 460 Bypass West. At the third traffic light, turn right onto Lemons Mill Rd. (Hwy 1962 West).
- III. Will see softball field on the right & turn right onto "Crawford Drive."
- IV. Continue on Crawford Drive to the Georgetown College stop sign and turn left.

II. DIRECTIONS FROM THE NORTH:

- I. I-75 South to Exit 126 (Georgetown); turn right off ramp onto
- II. Cherry Blossom Way (U.S.460 bypass)
- III. At the sixth (6th) traffic light turn right onto Lemons Mill Rd. (Hwy 1962 West).
- IV. Will see softball field on the right & turn right onto "Crawford Drive."
- V. Continue on Crawford Drive to the Georgetown College stop sign and turn left.

I. DIRECTIONS FROM THE WEST:

- I. I-64 East to Exit 69 (Georgetown); turn left off ramp onto U.S. 62.
- II. Proceed approximately 3 Miles and turn right onto U.S 460 bypass.
- III. Continue on the bypass (approximately 3.5 miles) and turn left at the 3rd traffic light onto Lemons Mill Rd.(Hwy 1962 West)
- IV. Continue on Crawford Drive to the Georgetown College stop sign and turn left.

II. DIRECTIONS FROM THE EAST:

- I. I-64 to I-75 north and follow the directions from the South
- II. 75 North to Exit 125 (Georgetown); turn left off the ramp onto U.S. 460.
- III. Take a left at the first traffic light onto U.S. 460 Bypass West. At the third traffic light, turn right onto Lemons Mill Rd. (Hwy 1962 West).
- IV. Will see softball field on the right & turn right onto "Crawford Drive."
